## ■ GUADALUPE 3-9-97 Pair ask aid to help refurbish novie house

GUADALUPE — A pair of San Luis Obispo developers will ask the Guadalupe Community Redevelopment Agency for \$50,000 Monday to help rehabilitate a decrepit downtown movie house.

Ron Holland and Joe Salvaggio need a total of \$150,000 to turn the Royal Theater into a discount movie theater that also would showcase live performances.

But they cannot do it without community support, according to staff reports.

The meeting begins 6 p.m. in City Hall Council

Chambers, 918 Obispo St.

Holland, of Holland Construction, and Salvaggio, his partner and architect, first solicited ideas and financial support from the agency in Novem-

Since then, the Planning Commission signed nonto the idea, recommending the agency waive warious development requirements and pitch in some funding.

An engineer also has determined the structure needs \$24,500 worth of seismic work completed before the building can be deemed safe for patrons.

"If the theater is successful, then it will be a catalyst for further downtown rejuvenation and small-business development," City Administrator Henry Lawrence said in a report to the agency, which recommends the \$50,000 expenditure.

If the developers fail to continue operating the refacility and do not exercise their option to buy it, -the agency could "step into the developers' shoes" and have a right to purchase the building itself for \$125,000, the report says.

"The administrator has thus confirmed that Holland and Salvaggio are serious parties with a track record of success in the restoration and operation of old theaters," Lawrence also wrote.

In other action Monday, the agency will consider forming a committee to handle day-to-day business with America West Redevelopment, Inc., developers of the Point Sal Dunes subdivision.
